### *"Mother that Came from the Sea"....Article Series* Article 5: The Festival

The festival of Maria Santissima Lauretana, now known as the festival of Our Lady of Altavilla Milicia, is the most famous in western Sicily. "I was never filled with more emotion and never was there a more picturesque image in seeing the many pilgrims and devotees climbing the hill towards Altavilla Milicia on the eve of the festival. They arrived continuously for days; walking barefoot, on horseback, in carriage, by train, by boat...." (*Giuseppe Pitre – Patron Festivals of Sicily, 1890*). Today, not much has changed. In the early



morning hours, before dawn, on the 6<sup>th</sup> of September, thousands of pilgrims meet at the train station in Altavilla Milicia, holding torches. They process from the train station, up the hill to the village towards the shrine; symbolically following the path that our Lady's image took from the sea over 400 years ago. With the sun still below the horizon, a "river of lights" shines from Altavilla Milicia down to the train station. As they begin to arrive in the village, the sun begins to rise. Upon arrival of the congregation, a mass is celebrated; officially opening the

religious festivities for the next three days. Masses are celebrated every hour over the next three days.

The period of the festival is rich in faith, popular piety and folklore that includes the entire community of Altavilla and the thousands that come from all over Sicily. The streets swell with people. They find rest and refreshments from the villagers who set up tables in the streets. Included also are stands where local specialties are sold; the most famous being the infamous sausage sandwich. One large attraction is the "Triumphal Chariot" or "Carru." It is a three-story structure whose base appears that of a sail ship and in the middle is a tower with our Lady's image at the very top. The "carru" symbolizes the ship on which our Lady's image traveled to the shores of Altavilla Milicia and the tower signifies the glory and light which She brought to this little village.





The festival culminates on September 8<sup>th</sup>; on the feast of the nativity of the Blessed Virgin. On that day, there are two important events. The first occurs at noon which is the procession of votive offerings. Hundreds of people process towards the shrine with symbolic gifts displaying either miracles received or miracles that they are praying for. At sunset, the solemn procession begins with the "vara." There is no translation to the word. Losely translated, the word can be referred to a

coffin, altar, or throne. The vara is carried on the shoulders of men who are referred to as the "Confraternita" or Brotherhood of Maria SS Lauretana. At three different times throughout the procession, couples of young children, dressed as angels, are suspended in the air, over the "vara," as they chant ancient praises to Mary. At approximately 10pm, the procession returns to the shrine. Many crowd inside the church, each one wishing to say goodbye to Her and asking for her continued protection. After the concluding prayer,



the image is placed back in its resting place above and behind the tabernacle as the emotion-filled crowd applauds. For those of you that have not been to Altavilla to see this beautiful festival, we recommend going at least once in your lifetime. It is truly beautiful.
